The Lord's Supper

Background:

Before being arrested and crucified, Jesus shared the Passover feast with his Disciples, During this dinner, Jesus paused, blessed the bread and fruit of the vine, and shared them with His Disciples, saying, "Do this in remembrance of me." (Luke, 22:19) This was the initiation of the Lord's Supper – a communal act of worship shared with all believers in celebration of redemption from spiritual death. And just as Jesus asked, we do this act of worship as often as necessary to remind us of our Savior, what He did for us, and what He desires to do for us.

The Communion Service:

We celebrate the Lord's Supper by sharing a small morsel of unleavened bread and a small cup of grape juice. We begin by preparing our hearts and minds for this event – besides baptism, it is the only ritual that Jesus required, so it is a very sacred time. While the meal is being served, no one is supposed to speak or move, and no one should be eating the meal. Singing of hymns may be allowed during this time, since this is an act of worship preparation. Once everyone has received a serving, the pastor will speak the words that Jesus spoke during His Last Supper. At that time, he will indicate when to eat the unleavened bread and when to drink the juice.

After sharing this meal, we shake hands with all of the participants as we sing hymns of praise for our salvation.



Responsive Reading: Isaiah 53:1-11 (NIV)

- 1 Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?
- 2 He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground. He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him.
- 3 He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain. Like one from whom people hide their faces he was despised, and we held him in low esteem.
- 4 Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted.
- 5 But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed.
- 6 We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.
- 7 He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.
- 8 By oppression and judgment he was taken away. Yet who of his generation protested? For he was cut off from the land of the living; for the transgression of my people he was punished.
- 9 He was assigned a grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death, though he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth.
- 10 Yet it was the Lord's will to crush him and cause him to suffer, and though the Lord makes his life an offering for sin, he will see his offspring and prolong his days, and the will of the Lord will prosper in his hand.
- 11 After he has suffered, he will see the light of life and be satisfied; by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities.

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
